Even though we have some decent competition with Cleveland and other surrounding communities, I believe that we are on the right path to make Akron an Art lovers destination and I will continue to support this journey. I will also roll out an SMS texting app and an all call that citizens can sign up for (small discount on trash), as well as mailers in the water bills as well as separately, and they will get notified when new exhibits and shows arrive or are available. I will champion the fact that we have so many free things here in Akron but not everyone knows about them. Through this I will partner with APS and all other local schools to promote our art. It is possible that we could partner in such a way that we could have a traveling show, going from school to school and possibly long term care facilities.

• Where will arts and culture fall within your priorities?

Being an educator and a life-long lover of architecture and history, arts and culture are very high on my priority list on a personal level. My father-in-law has an art-based degree as does my sister-in-law, and so we are raising our children in a very art-centered family. I believe art and culture are the bedrock of society and as such are very important. FOUR: PUBLIC ART (ONLY FOR CITY OF AKRON MAYORAL CANDIDATES)

In 2020, Akron City Council formally adopted the Akron Public Art Master Plan which included:

- a thoughtfully designed Administrative Guide has been provided here as an attachment and which is available at https://www.akronpublicart.com/how-does-itwork;
- established a Commission to be fully and appropriately staffed by the City of Akron;
- codified a commitment of one perfect (1%) TIF Percent for Art to be used exclusively for the development and maintenance of the visual public art collection of the City of Akron;
- adopted the national definition of public art to be any visual art available to the public a minimum of 40 hours per week which has been paid for with public dollars or resides on public land;
- and committed to staff developing and presenting an annual work plan and budget to Akron City Council in order to be included in the General Operating Budget.

• How would your administration ensure the structures and processes created in collaboration with City staff are being fully realized and implemented?

Candidate Response: KEITH MILLS

A full time staff member with access to resources will be on staff, meeting the outlined commitment made above for the commission. By having true and meaningful follow-through, this will help ensure that these structures and processes will be realized and implemented. We will also raise that commitment from 1% to 2% and routinely check to see if more monies and resources are needed in order to fulfill the mission. Unfortunately, I can only use words for now but I give my word, as an educator, a father and lover of knowledge, that I (as someone who grew up poor and never got to appreciate varied amounts of art until I met my wife) will ensure that we meet goals and plans laid out to further promote our arts and culture. Communication that is positive, beneficial, meaningful and constructive is essential in moving this city as a whole forward and making this city a place people want to move to and in which to thrive.
